About us	Airlie Artist's Residency aims to support process-based artists by offering a studio and living space in a unique natural environment. Set in the Den of Airlie, an SSSI (Site of Specific Scientific Interest), in a converted stable building that forms part of the Airlie Estate. The studio overlooks the River Isla and is surrounded by the quiet of forest and diverse wildlife, offering a large multipurpose room filled with natural light, and an apartment above. This is the residency's first year, and it plans in time to bring a variety of artists, musicians and visual arts practitioners into a place of heritage and natural beauty.

We do not have any specific requirements and are happy to open our doors to anyone who would be inspired by Coll and want to channel this into their art, which ever form it may take.
Accommodation offered	Accommodation is provided with the studio space at Coll Bunkhouse. The artist would have a private room for the duration of the hire period, although full bunkhouse exclusivity cannot be guaranteed it is often quieter in these months. Travel	An Cridhe and the Coll Bunkhouse is located in Arinagour, the main village on the Isle of Coll. It is a 15 minute walk from the ferry terminal. There is no public transport on Coll, should somebody wish to explore the island a car is recommended, however An Cridhe and the Post Office rent out bikes as well.
Accessibility	The Coll Bunkhouse and An Cridhe are fully accessible, all on one floor and both have accessible bathrooms available for use. We welcome animals in both buildings and both spaces are well lit. An Cridhe/Boll Bunkhouse is accessible via hard packed track although during periods of wet weather this does become scattered with puddles. Both buildings have ramps on entry. Quiet space is available in An Cridhe.
Insurance	An Cridhe and the Coll Bunkhouse has Public and Product Liability insurance. Due to the nature of the Isle of Coll being accessible mainly by ferry (although a flight is available) and these ferries depending on weather, it would be recommended that the artist has travel insurance.

Bothy Project, Isle of Eigg

About us	Bothy Project is a unique and independent charitable organisation operating in a
	set of rural contexts, providing creative residencies in bespoke small-scale, offgrid spaces to explore <i>creativity, landscape and living simply</i> .
	We provide residences for practitioners in visual arts, craft & design, music, literature and performance, as well as thinkers, researchers and people local to each bothy. Our residencies are supported by a public programme which endeavours to share the most interesting and memorable learning generated by residents through a series of talks, podcasts and posters.
	Active in Scotland since 2011, Bothy Project was initiated by artist Bobby Niven and architect lain MacLeod, as part of the 2011 RSA Residencies for Scotland Programme. Since then, we have hosted nearly 400 residencies. Residencies are currently held at Sweeney's Bothy, a bespoke off-grid building in unique surroundings on the Isle of Eigg.

Studio Facilities	Sweeney's Bothy is a modern off-grid, live/work space designed specifically for artists' residencies. It is a comfortable and warm space heated by a wood-burning stove.
	Facilities include a library, desk and chair, mezzanine double bed, kitchenette, wood-burning stove (with hot plate and oven), gas hob, outdoor shower, composting toilet and renewable energy system (electric and hot water).
	The bothy strikes a balance between the priorities for making-thinking-doing and connecting with the surrounding environment. Facilities at the bothy have been designed to support residents' focus and diminish the distractions of digitally connected life. As such there is no Wi-Fi and limited power and phone signal at the bothy.

Costs	Cost of residency at Sweeney's Both: £720 per week (subsidised by 20%) Including 7 nights of Bothy accommodation, bedding, firewood, cleaning, transport to/from Eigg pier to Bothy.
Minimum Period	Minimum stay: 1 week The residency can be split over several visits.
Maximum Period	By negotiation.
	Sweeney's Bothy is a simple dwelling and we find people enjoy to stay for 1-2 weeks at a time. Longer residencies can be proposed and discussed but we advise splitting a longer residency over a number of visits.
Other facilities	N/A
Support offered	Bothy Project staff will meet with the selected resident (either in-person or online) to provide advice and support regarding the residency. Prior to and during the



	residency, the resident will be supported by Sweeney's Bothy's host who lives on the Isle of Eigg and can connect the resident to Eigg's community and events. The RSA Partnership Residency cost is discounted by 20%. No other financial support is available.
Promotional support offered	The RSA residency and artist will be promoted through Bothy Project's website, newsletter and social media platforms.
Exhibition or other opportunities	There is the possibility for the selected resident to participate in Bothy Project's public programme of talks, podcasts and posters.
Requirements	N/A
Accommodation offered	Sweeney's Bothy is designed to suit solo-occupancy and features a mezzanine double bed (bedding provided), an outdoor shower and an external composting toilet.

Travel	Residents must travel to the Isle of Eigg by ferry. We recommend that residents take the Mallaig to Eigg ferry and encourage travel to Mallaig by train. For further details, please see Sweeney's Bothy travel & facilities webpage.

Cove Park, Argyll and Bute

About us	Cove Park is an international residency based on a 50-acre rural site overlooking Loch Long in Argyll, on Scotland's west coast. We welcome national and international artists, creative practitioners, and researchers working in all art forms and creative disciplines and at every career stage. Our programme supports research, experimentation, and the development and production of new work.

Studio Facilities	Private, brightly lit studios suitable for all types of work (one studio has a 60-litre kiln). Studios are c. 16ft x 20ft and have sinks.
Costs	£550 - £600 per week for a Cube (depending upon time of year). The studio is included in this cost. Cove Park's Pods, which are suitable for families, can also be reserved (prices available on request).
Minimum Period	2 weeks
Maximum Period	4 weeks
Other facilities	All residents have 24-hour access to the Jacobs Building on site and its communal facilities, including a library, large open plan kitchen, dining area, workspaces, meeting room, and laundry. Cove Park's offices have two printers/photocopiers, and the Jacobs Building has reliable wi-fi.
Support offered	The RSA resident will be supported fully by Cove Park's Director, Programmes Producer, and the wider Cove Park team. As with all forthcoming residents, the RSA artist will receive the Cove Park Handbook in advance of their residency and information on the facilities, local amenities, tools, and equipment available. Artists are welcome to contact staff in advance of their residency to discuss specific requirements and to receive support with planning and research. The RSA resident will be welcome (but not obliged) to take part in informal and professional events designed to bring the artists on site together with staff and guests, these can include lunches, dinners, studios discussions, talks, screenings and public events.
Promotional support offered	The residency will feature on Cove Park's website, in our monthly Newsletter, and on social media. We will work with the artist on the text for these platforms.
Exhibition or other opportunities	Cove Park does not have a dedicated gallery or run a regular programme of exhibitions. The RSA resident will be invited to join Cove Park's Associates programme, which offers residencies and other opportunities for our former residents. If appropriate, former residents can be invited to take part in our engagement programme, devising and leading workshops for young people and adults in our local community (this work is paid at SAU rates)
Requirements	N/A
Accommodation offered	All residents are provided with private accommodation (including shower room, small kitchen, double bed, sitting area, and desk). Parking is available. Cove Park has accommodation suitable for those bringing children (please discuss this with Cove Park directly). Although it is possible to find childcare locally, this can be
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	difficult due to demand and the limited number of childminders on the Rosneath Peninsula).
Alternative accommodation	We do not make studios available to those living off-site.
Travel	Cove Park is accessible by public transport. We are 30 minutes by car or public transport from Helensburgh, our nearest town. It is also possible to come via train from Glasgow Central to meet a ferry crossing from Gourock to Kilcreggan on the Rosneath Peninsula (just 10 minutes by bus or taxi to Cove Park).
Accessibility	We have units of accommodation and studios with level access which are suitable for wheelchair users. Cove Park is on a rural hillside and some areas of the site feature rough terrain. The spaces are private and quiet. The Jacobs Building is fully accessible for wheelchair users. It also has baby changing facilities. Support animals are welcome, but the site does have livestock (sheep and Highland cows) and therefore dogs must be kept on a. lead. We invite residents to submit an access statement prior to their residencies and will work to support each participant's specific needs and requirements.
Insurance	Cove Park has public liability insurance but our insurance does not cover residents' travel.



Cromarty Arts Trust

About us	The Cromarty Arts Trust aims to develop an appetite and capacity for cultural creativity in individuals and communities in Cromarty and the Black Isle. We aim to promote the value of creativity and break barriers to participation and interest in all aspects of creative activity. We will engage with people at an early stage in their experience of creativity to help stimulate a lifelong interest.
	 Since 1987, we have restored and converted three architecturally important buildings in Cromarty: The Old Brewery, restored in 1989 and now used for educational courses, accommodation, meetings and workshops. The Stables a Listed Grade. A building restored in 1995, now used as a gallery, performance space and artists' studios. Ardyne, a fine example of a merchant's house restored in 1994 and used as offices and artists accommodation.

Studio Facilities	Private studio 'bay' space in a tranquil, rural location at converted Stable block with 6 other artists currently working there (at various times). There is access to a sink (shared with one other artist), plus free Wi-Fi and parking. Beautiful grounds and stunning views, just a 15 min walk from the vibrant and 'arty' town of Cromarty.
Costs	A 1 month residency would cost £1,800. A 2 month residency would cost £3,200.
Minimum Period	1 month
Maximum Period	2 months Longer residences can be arranged if required.
Other facilities	We can offer use of one or more easels to save having to transport them. Depending on the media being used, we have certain technical equipment that may be able to be utilised (e.g. for sound/video). The residency would ideally take place between November – March when there is less pressure on our accommodation, however we would consider other times of year if needed. We will always be as flexible as possible, but dates would have to work with residencies already booked in.
Support offered	At Cromarty we can offer community engagement with local people who are very friendly and welcoming to artists sharing their town. It is an inspiring environment full of artistic, creative people and a stunning part of the world to base yourself.
	The Cromarty Arts Trust runs a year-round programme of live music, applied crafts and visual arts courses, music workshops, literary events, etc., which may also be of interest to artists-in-residence. We can offer advice with travel and although there is excellent public transport and the town has a small supermarket, cheese shop and bakery, we find having a car is pretty essential, so we would recommend that any artist in residence has their own transport.
Promotional support offered	Cromarty Arts Trust is a well-established organisation with a full programme of arts and music events. As a result, we have an excellent profile and an enviable reputation both locally and further afield. We have built up a strong and positive relationship with local press and media and artists here on a residency programme



	could tap into this. We also have a growing database of over 1800 people interested in the arts and cultural projects that have chosen to receive our fortnightly Enews. Posters, leaflets and flyers are all produced in-house and are regularly distributed in the area. Our Facebook and Instagram and X pages are vibrant and popular, and our website is well-used.
Exhibition or other opportunities	We are very fortunate to have a beautiful gallery in our Stables venue where the studio space is also located (downstairs). This comfortable room is equipped with a hanging system, projector and screen and moveable spotlights, plus we have white plinths of various heights and sizes, making it a pleasant and versatile exhibition space. We regularly host successful exhibitions here, including preview nights and events, often enhanced by drinks and canapes, live music (there is a baby grand piano also permanently in this room), demonstrations, etc.
	We also have a room in our Old Brewery building which can be used for performance or smaller scale exhibitions. This room is also well lit and has a hanging system.
	We would be delighted to organise a special event for the RSA artist, either an exhibition with preview night or an Open Studio day or an opportunity to work with the local community, e.g. workshop or class, should the artist wish it.
Requirements	N/A
Accommodation offered	Accommodation is available at Ardyne, a well-appointed, shared house in the middle of the village of Cromarty, each room having its own study area, en-suite facilities and shared kitchen. We provide bedding, heating, regular cleaning and free Wi-Fi and there is on-street parking right outside. The local shops are practically next door and the restaurants, beaches, harbour etc., are a short walk away.
Alternative accommodation	Alternative accommodation may be able to be provided at another of our venues, the Old Brewery on Burnside Place. This beautiful, converted building can sleep up to 22 in single, twin and triple rooms with communal spaces and shared bathrooms (between two rooms – if other occupants happen to be there), however, as we take fairly regular group bookings and sometimes hire out the entire building, we couldn't guarantee this option would be available.
