

Fixed term, freelance position at Forgan Arts Centre in North-East Fife.

This role is suitable for someone with a strong interest in working with children and art education. The Play Worker will support the delivery of our Art Club for Children aged 5-12 years during the Fife school holidays.

Children's Art Club (Spring) is a two-week long holiday club for children with an interest in art and creativity. It takes place Monday-Friday, 9am-3.30pm. The Club is delivered in two one week-long blocks, 1-5 and 8-12 April 2024. We are looking to multiple Play Workers to support and facilitate Children's Art Club.

Description of Role & Duties

Play Workers will support the Lead Artist to deliver creative activities to a group of 24-32 children.

Duties include:

- Setting up the workspace with the Lead Artists.
- Registering children and their grown up(s) on arrival, ensuring requisite paperwork has been received and signed.
- Registering any access needs, allergies, medication, or other notes about the child that day. Communicating this across the team.
- Welcoming the children to the centre and helping them settle in, store their bags, coats, and lunches.
- Taking children's register.
- Providing children with support throughout the art activities both indoors and out.
- Assisting the Lead Artist.
- Taking part in games with the children both inside and out.
- Helping to maintain a clear working space throughout the activities.
- Preparing snacks and assisting children with their packed lunches.
- Communicating with the children about the activities they'll be doing.
- Moving tables and chairs in-line with activity needs.
- Tidying up at the end of the session.
- Ensuring the safety of the children with Play Workers.
